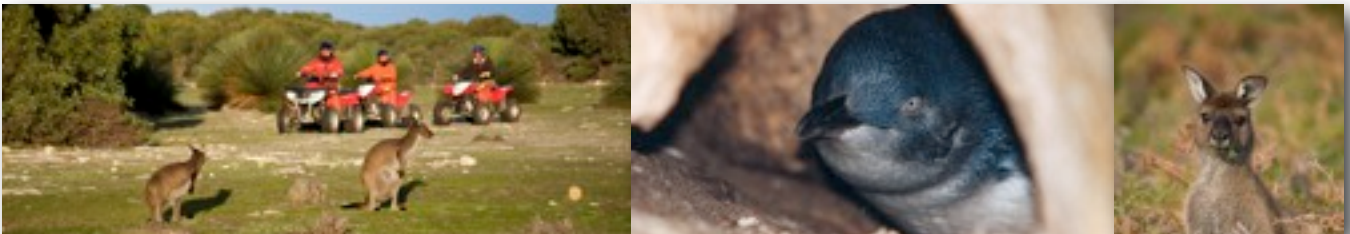




Kangaroo Island is not normally known for its' nightlife but there really is a lot going on! After dark is gets pretty wild - no not bars and dance clubs but animal activity. Little penguins come ashore after a big day out - they are not nocturnal but they work very long days. At dusk they return from fishing and return to their nest burrows on-shore.

Species such as kangaroos and wallabies are crepuscular (mainly active dawn and dusk) and some are completely nocturnal. Our nocturnal species include four species of possum, southern brown bandicoots and a range of birds. These reserve their activity for when it is totally dark to escape ending up as lunch for one of many predators active on the Island. The following four options give some choices for you to experience Kangaroo Island after dark.



### Bright lights on arrival

This is a step by step escape from civilisation - start in the city, fly to the Island and be met by your guide at the Airport and take a short drive to the main town of Kingscote. Enjoy dinner at Restaurant Bella before learning how penguins have adapted to life in town. After dark wildlife on the roads can be very active as they move out to graze so expect a few encounters on the way to Southern Ocean Lodge. A drive through farm paddocks on the way gives a great feel for the abundance of native animals on the Island. \$1302.00 for two, \$171.00 per person thereafter.

### Quad biking and bush picnic

Depart Southern Ocean Lodge and drive to a private farm for a dusk quad bike tour - getting off the beaten track to see animals emerge to feed. Enjoy a picnic dinner in the bush before seeking out a wild colony of little penguins at Point Ellen. A drive through farm paddocks on the way back to the Lodge gives a great feel for the abundance of native animals on the Island. \$1683.00 for two, \$246.00 per person thereafter

### Out on the town

Starting from Southern Ocean Lodge, drive into the town Kingscote and have dinner at Restaurant Bella before learning how penguins have adapted to life in town. After dark wildlife on the roads can be very active as animals move out to graze so expect a few encounters on the way back to Southern Ocean Lodge. A drive through farm paddocks on the way back gives a great feel for the abundance of native animals on the Island. \$1763.00 for two, \$173.00 per person thereafter.

### Bush barbeque

Depart Southern Ocean Lodge for a private bush venue and enjoy a barbeque dinner. Savour a glass of fine wine as wallabies and kangaroos emerge to graze before seeking out a wild colony of little penguins at Point Ellen. A drive through farm paddocks once it is completely dark gives a great feel for the abundance of native animals on the Island. \$1206.00 for two, \$116.00 per person thereafter.
